AUGUST IS DENTAL MONTH



What if you never brushed your teeth? Your mouth would be sore, and you would probably have trouble eating. Infections from your mouth would spread throughout your body, making you feel tired and sick all the time. The same thing happens in your pet's mouth. Most dental problems in animals occur because of neglect, but with regular dental care, at home and your veterinarian's office, you can prevent serious dental problems for your pet before they begin.

Dental cleanings usually take about 20 minutes. Here are the simple steps:

- Bring your pet in first thing on your scheduled morning. Any needed exams or lab work will be done first.
- Your pet will be sedated and monitored on a gas anesthesia that is very safe.
 - An exam is performed on the gums, teeth, and mouth. Any tooth problems are addressed if they need more treatment.
 - \checkmark An ultrasonic scalar is used to remove the tartar from the teeth.
- ✓ A polisher is used to smooth the surfaces of the teeth and remove plaque or bits of tartar.

 \checkmark A fluoride treatment or Oravet sealant are applied to the teeth.

✓ Your pet is removed from the gas anesthesia and wakes up very quickly.

The Facts on Dental Disease



- "Flip the Lip" Lift your pets lip up entirely in order to see the gum line. Inflamed gums, bleeding gums, halitosis (bad breath), or loose teeth can be a sign of dental problems.
- Does your pet chew on rocks or other hard materials? It may have a fractured tooth that needs some dental work before it gets infected.
- Dental disease affects 80% of dogs and 70% of cats and is the most common disease in domestic pets but it can be prevented.
- Cats commonly get cavities!! These cavities can cause a tooth to decay if not treated.
- By having dental cleanings at your veterinarian office and having a consistent dental home care plan your pet can live up to 2 years longer and have a healthier and happier life!!
- Dental care is not a one shot deal. Tartar begins accumulating again as soon as the pet goes home. Regular dental cleanings and a good home treatment plan is the key to keeping the tartar away!

Ticks are out, and they aren't playing around this year. So far, we have seen A 4X INCREASE 1 in tick borne diseases contracted in our area. This is why Tick prevention is so important- it can prevent the tick from having enough time to transmit any diseases if it bites your pet!

Here Are 10 Things to Know as a Pet Owner About These Blood Suckers-

#1: Ticks can be active **all year long**, and don't always disappear during the winter

Although many people think that ticks, fleas, and mosquitoes, die off during the winter, this is not true. These pesky parasites are more likely lurking in leaf litter, your home, or on your pet, during the colder months waiting to spring forth as soon as temperatures warm up.

#2: Ticks can be difficult to spot, but they have **favorite hiding places**

- In & around the ears
 - Between the toes
 - In the groin area
- Under the collar or clothing
 - On the eyelids

#3: Ticks can transmit a variety of diseases to pets and you

- Anaplasmosis
 - Ehrlichiosis
- Lyme's Disease
- Rocky Mountain spotted fever
 - Tick paralysis
 - Tularemia
 - Babesiosis
 - Powassan virus disease

#4: Ehrlichiosis is the most common tick-borne disease we see here at Flanary Veterinary Clinic, and in Western Kentucky- Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever and Ehrlichiosis take the top spots as of 2021. Since infection happens so frequently in this area, we highly recommend testing your pet annually for tick-borne diseases, including Lyme disease, anaplasmosis, and ehrlichiosis.

#5: Not all ticks transmit Lyme disease

Each tick species transmits certain diseases. While many species transmit multiple pathogens, only one can spread Lyme disease—the black-legged tick, or deer tick.

#6: Be aware of the tick-borne diseases in your area, for your entire family's safety- People can be affected by the same tick-borne illnesses as their pets. Examples are Lyme's disease, Ehrlichiosis, Anaplasmosis, and more.

#7: Ticks need attachment for an extended period of time to transmit disease- Ticks do not transmit pathogens immediately as they bite—they often require attachment for at least several hours to pass along disease. For example, deer ticks must be attached for about 48 hours before they transmit Lyme disease.

#8: Ticks do not fall from trees to land on you or your petTicks climb up weeds, bushes, and shrubs to quest for their next host, and will attach to your legs as you brush past.

#9: Year-round tick prevention will keep your pet safe Winter weather can be unpredictable, and temperatures over the past few years in this area do not stay below freezing long. You can remove leaf litter, keep bushes, shrubs, and weeds trimmed, and keep your pet on prevention to reduce tick habitat & chance of disease in your yard.


#10: Many tick-prevention products are available for your petDr. Flanary and Dr. Ferrell both recommend Bravecto for Flea and Tick protection for your Dogs & Cats- year-round.

What should I do if I find a tick on me or my dog?

1. Use fine tipped tweezers or disposable gloves to handle the tick. Infectious agents may be contracted through mucous membranes or breaks in the skin simply by handling infected ticks.

- 2. Grasp the tick as close to the skin surface as possible. This reduces the possibility of the head detaching from the body upon removal.
 - 3. Pull the tick straight out with a steady, even pressure. Continue applying steady pressure even if the tick does not release immediately.
 - *4.* After removing the tick, thoroughly disinfect the bite area and wash your hands with soap and water.

*Home remedies such as applying petroleum jelly or grease or touching the rear of the tick with a hot match cause the tick to salivate and increase the chance of getting a disease. *
